

Zero/Pre-Accreditation visit at University of Veterinary & Animal Sciences (UVAS) Ravi-Campus Pattoki

In June 2002 on the up-gradation of the college of Veterinary Sciences (CVS), Lahore to the status of the University, Punjab Government allotted about 1000 acres at Pattoki for the establishment of the sub-campus for the education and research work activities. This is named as Ravi Campus, Pattoki. This campus is offering 6 undergraduate and 10 post graduate degree programs. Total strength of students in this campus is almost 1200 with 90 teaching faculty.



Three Accreditation Inspection Committees (AICs) comprising of Dr. Abdul Ghaffar, Secretary NAEAC as a convener, Prof. (Retd). Dr. Muhammad Aslam Mirza, Faculty of Animal Husbandry, University of Agriculture, Faisalabad (UAF), Prof. (Retd). Dr. Abdul Rab, Department of Zoology, Women University, Swabi and Prof. (Retd). Dr. Ahsan ul Haq, Faculty of Animal Husbandry, UAF as members conducted Zero/Pre-Accreditation visit of Dairy Technology, Fisheries & Aquaculture and Poultry Science degree programs at University of Veterinary & Animal Sciences (UVAS), Ravi-Campus Pattoki.



Dr. Arshad Javid, Principal Officer, Ravi Campus, Prof. Dr. Saima, Dean, Faculty of Animal Production & Technology (FAP&T), Ravi Campus, all HoDs of respective departments and other faculty members received and welcomed the guests. Prof. Dr. Saima, Dean, FAP&T, Ravi Campus chaired the inaugural session. For the introduction of UVAS Pattoki campus, a documentary was played where university accomplishments and infrastructure was highlighted. Later another documentary highlighted flood relief activities carried out by UVAS staff and students was also played. Later, Dr. Abdul Ghaffar, Secretary NAEAC presented a brief overview of NAEAC activities and achievements made so far. The inaugural session was attended by Principal Officer, Dean, HoDs of respective departments and other faculty members. Earlier common facilities like hostel, medical, indoor/outdoor sports facility, transport and central lab complex were visited by all AIC members.

Then AICs moved to relevant departments where detailed presentations and discussions were held. Each HoD presented the relevant AIC in detail the departmental achievements as per itinerary. AICs also visited departmental infrastructure including labs, classrooms, library, faculty offices, experimental research area (Livestock, Dairy, poultry farms and fisheries ponds) and held meeting with students of the department to get an insight of teaching/working environment in the departments. After lunch, two major activities (curriculum review and meeting with individual faculty) were carried out. Each course file was checked for its contents like lecture breakdown, assignments and results. AICs held individual faculty meeting to know the working environment and job satisfaction level and student teacher interaction.

In the informal concluding session of the visit, Secretary NAEAC thanked for their cooperation and facilitation to conduct this zero visit of 3 programs. Dr. Saima thanked NAEAC team for their day-long deliberations and inspection visit. In order to raise the threshold for education and increase the value of the graduates produced, he promised that the recommendations given by the AICs would be put into action.
